GUEST SPEAKER: Olive Foley:

Olive Foley is the wife of the late Anthony Foley, an Irish and Munster rugby playing legend whose untimely death on October 16th, 2016 led to a national and international outpouring of sadness over his sudden death but also support for Olive and her young family. The Tuamgraney, Co. Clare native's life changed forever when word came back to her in her Killaloe, Co. Clare home that her husband had died overnight ahead of a game Munster, whom he was coach of at the time, were due to play.

It was any young mother's living nightmare as she was forced to deal with the loss of her loving partner and adoring father of her two sons Daniel (10) and Tony (13). Olive's experience has told her that family and community is most definitely worth celebrating and that it is always there for you, especially when most needed. Through her difficulties she has seen family at its best and she has placed her trust in God. Olive is a former banker but is now working closely with Sr Helen Culhane and The Children's Grief Centre Limerick in her role as ambassador.

New Lease of Life

Ever been entrusted with a big job and completely messed up? If you've made big mistakes in the work place, the chances are that you won't be entrusted with that job again. If you make a mistake in family circles, the people who love you most probably will give you a second chance but they might be keeping a watchful eye on you just the same.



In the days after Jesus' death and resurrection Peter must have been suffering huge guilt. He had been one of Jesus' most ardent followers and yet it was Peter who had denied Jesus three times during his arrest and trial. When we have had a difficult or traumatic time it is human nature to retreat into our comfort zones. This is exactly what Peter is doing in today's story. Jesus might have hoped that his disciples would be out and about spreading the good news, but Peter is back on the lake doing what he knows best.... fishing!

When we hit difficult times in our lives and all we are able to do is hide from the world, what we need most is for someone to give us a helping hand. In today's gospel Jesus appears to Peter and the disciples from the shore whilst they are out fishing. Peter, as impetuous as ever, jumps into the water and swims to meet him. The others follow in the boat. On the shore Jesus takes some bread, and some fish that his disciples have just caught, and they share a simple meal. Then Jesus turns to Peter and asks "Do you love me?" Three times he asks the same question, and three times Peter replies that he does. It's as though Jesus is giving him the opportunity to make amends for his three denials. Jesus is offering more than forgiveness. He's offering healing and recovery. It isn't hard to imagine how delighted Peter must have felt on this day. Perhaps he hadn't let Jesus down after all. Jesus still loved him and valued him. This was Peter's big second chance and new lease of life.

May Sunday is celebrated this Sunday. It is very special as it is the start of The Bicentenary celebrations of the laying of the foundation stone of Holy Cross Church.
